The public consultation will be advertised on the Beech Parish Council Website, on Nextdoor Beech and on the Parish Council Noticeboard. There will be a leaflet printed, costing £8.80, and this will be distributed to every household with details of the consultation. The consultation shall be held over a two day period, Friday and Saturday, to allow as many people as possible to visit, the clerk will confirm dates when the Village Hall availability has been checked.
