# 'Meet the Funders' Event, 24 June 2019 at Penns Place, Petersfield

Report by Councillor Graham Webb, Beech Parish Council

The event consisted of a series of presentations by funders, organised jointly by EHDC and Community First (the local umbrella organisation for charities and other 'third sector' organisations).

# 1. Funding available from EHDC

- **Councillor grants:** Each district councillor has £4,500 available to distribute in their area in the year commencing 3 June 2019, with each grant a maximum of £1,000.
- *Unallocated S106 money:* We know about this. The current round of applications closes on 31 July, and applications will reopen later this year.
- **Supporting Community Grant:** Opens in April 2020. Will make grants of up to £25,000 for capital projects, principally for the purpose of "reducing social isolation".
- EHDC Community Lottery: Will launch later in 2019 but will benefit only charities.

#### 2. National Lottery Community Fund

- Awards for All: Grants of up to £10,000.
- Reaching Communities: Grants of over £10,000 (up to £500,000 or more).

Parish councils are eligible to apply, and grants can be made for capital projects. They can't make grants to replace public authority funding, or to pay for projects that have already been completed. (Their website tnlcommunityfund.org.uk seems to show they have made plenty of £10,000 grants towards footpaths within and between villages.) Could also be relevant to Beech Village Hall for their mooted expansion scheme.

- 3. National Lottery Heritage Fund n/a to Beech
- 4. Arts Council National Lottery Grants n/a to Beech

- **5. Sport England** *Community Asset Fund, and Small Grants Scheme* grants of up to £10,000. Could be of interest to Beech Village Hall re initiatives for the Recreation Ground or Village Green.
- **6. Hampshire & IOW Community Foundation** –do not fund capital projects (and specialise in small grants relating to disadvantaged beneficiaries).
- **7. South Downs National Park Trust** *Communities Fund* will not fund projects whose main benefit will fall outside the national park.
