## **Objective**

Undertake a Thermal Survey of Beech properties to raise awareness, identify opportunities, and lead to real actions that reduce CO2 emissions from home heating

- 1. Maximise participation. Target to achieve a minimum of 60 out of 240 homes (25%)
- 2. Assessment of current state. 'Self-assessment' to establish baseline emissions and comparison to other similar homes.
- 3. Survey to yield a set of individual and average metric that we can be used to identify and prioritise candidate areas for action and to assess current state and track long term progress
- 4. Workshop with specialists to identify detail actions at end of Thermal survey
- 5. Follow up to categorise actions, status and outcome after 3 months
- **6.** Follow up annual survey to assess change in metrics annually.



# Survey feedback

5 responses of disappointment with scope of survey	Villagers had expected to have multiple elevations surveyed. We documented that survey would cover elevations of their property meaning one elevation and the roof. Some villagers have assumed this meant all of their property despite the sample report only showing one image.	Email responses to all5 explaining scope.  1 of 5 insisting on full refund See proposal below for resolution plan

#### Complaint resolution plan

If a village expresses disatisfaction with the results of the Thermal Survey we will:

- 1. Offer a full refund of the £30.50 Thermal Survey fee subject to:
  - a) Their agreement not use any of the materials or intellectual property we have provided
  - b) The destruction of the said materials
- 2. Offer a second survey of a specified elevation at a cost of £30.50
  - The survey would be on a specific date (approx. 2-3 weeks time) and subject to:
    - i. Weather conditions
    - ii. A Minimum 'funding' to be agreed with iRed

### Funding for resolution plan

- 3. iRed have agreed that up to the 12 extra surveys over the base agreement of 60 can be used to offer a customer refund or a second survey (subject to minimum numbers for the second survey)
- 4. iRed will document to us the minimum funding required to support
- 5. We would expect some villagers would pay to have a second elevation surveyed
