22.095 ROAD SAFETY WORKING GROUP

i) Beech Road Safety Working Group - Report to Parish Council September 2022

On-road Footways: Ian Janes (HCC Safety Engineer) is still in the process of designing the on-road footways for the village centre and Kings Hill. This exercise includes a review of road signs in the village.

New Off-Road Footways: An HCC feasibility study, costing £12,500 plus VAT, has been commissioned, to cover three sections of Medstead Road:

Section 1: 510m alongside Forestry England land east of the Bushy Leaze Wood entrance;

Section 2: 137m alongside Forestry England land west of the Bushy Leaze Wood entrance; and

Section 3: 406m running west from 70/72 Kings Hill to Alton Abbey.

The study is just commencing, with conference calls and a site visit due with HCC over the next 2 weeks. The study is due to be completed before Christmas.

Screening the private woodland footpath: The planting of permanent screening is pencilled in for the weekend of 4-7 November, and the plants have been purchased. Ground conditions are currently still too hard to permit the installation of the temporary screen fence, but it is hoped that this will happen over the next few weeks.

- 22.100 NORTH HAMPSHIRE DOWNS AREA OF OUTSTANDING NATURAL BEAUTY (AONB) Proposed Ingrid McCormack, Seconded Kim Eakers, UNANIMOUSLY RESOLVED: to write to MP Damien Hinds, County Councillor Mark Kemp-Gee and District Councillor Tony Costigan supporting the principle of an "Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty" for the North Hampshire Downs.

Dear

Proposed North Hampshire Downs AONB

A proposal is being worked up for the creation of a new Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB) – the North Hampshire Downs, encompassing the countryside area between Basingstoke, Odiham, Farnham, Alton and Alresford. It would include Beech and the other rural parishes in your constituency north of Alton and Four Marks/South Medstead. I attach a document that includes a map of the proposed AONB.

The catalyst has been a proposal to build 2,500 houses at Cliddesden, south of Basingstoke – see www.stanhd.com. The wider AONB area is supported by the CPRE. I believe that Basingstoke & Deane Borough Council is also in favour.

As you may know, any development in an AONB must protect the landscape, much the same way as in a national park, and the principal purpose of the campaign is to protect this area of unspoilt countryside from large scale housing development.

Beech Parish Council has agreed to support this campaign, as the downland countryside north of Alton is just as attractive and valued (by residents of the Alton area) as in the South Downs National Park (SDNP) immediately to the south, and deserves similar protection.

We believe that any 'non-small' new development along the A31 corridor will be most sustainable in, or on the immediate outskirts of, the existing larger settlements of Alton and Four Marks/South Medstead. Medium/large scale new development infilling elsewhere along the A31 (between Ropley and the Surrey border) will only serve to bring about the undesirable 'A31 conurbation' sprawl that the volume housebuilders dream of, to the detriment of everyone who lives in and enjoys this part of Hampshire, including residents of Alton and Four Marks/South Medstead.

The AONB designation should prove to be a stronger defence against the forces that might push East Hampshire towards medium/large scale development in the countryside around Alton; those forces being principally the skewing of housing development in the district caused by 57% of its area being in the 'protected' SDNP. We wish to end the possibility of unsuitable proposals like the building of 1,200 houses at Chawton Park Farm, totally detached from the existing settlements with facilities and services.

Of course, AONB designation does not preclude small scale development in the countryside, so long as it respects the landscape character and preserves its quality and value.

We at Beech Parish Council very much hope that you will lend your active support to the proposal to create a North Hampshire Downs AONB with boundaries corresponding to those on the attached map. Kind regards
